The College of Arts and Sciences is pleased to announce the availability of research, scholarship, or creative activity funding for graduate students in the 2024/2025 academic year. Award amounts range from \$1000 to \$4000, dependent upon the funding source.

Eligibility

Currently enrolled part-time or full-time graduate students in any <u>discipline within the</u>

<u>College of Arts and Sciences</u> at Washington State University are eligible. Students must meet

<u>CAS scholarship eligibility</u> criteria in order to receive a scholarship.

Awards (Applicants may apply for the General Research, Scholarship or Creative Activity Award or the Boeing Graduate Fellowship)

1. General Research, Scholarship and Creative Activities

Multiple scholarship funds will support students engaged in new or continuing projects or conference travel in science, social science, humanities, or arts disciplines, or an entrepreneurial effort.

2. Boeing Graduate Fellowship in Environmental Studies

The Boeing Fellowship provides support for the multi-disciplinary study of environmental issues, including sociological, political, historical, cultural, literary, artistic, and scientific bases. A research project or creative activity that addresses some aspect of an important environmental issue or problem will be the primary selection criterion. The fellowship period will be for one academic year, beginning in Summer 2024 and ending with the Spring 2025 semester.

Application

Please submit an application of no more than 6 pages in length that includes all of the following components:

1. CAS Grant and Fellowship Support Cover Sheet (1 pg)

The fillable pdf cover sheet form for this program can be found at https://cas.wsu.edu/gfs/internal-funding-opportunities/. All requested information must be provided.

2. Research/Creative Activity Description (2 pages)

In non-technical language, provide a two-page description including:

- a. A project overview of your current or planned research, scholarship, or creative activity and its significance.
- b. An explanation of the project objectives and the work plan for accomplishing them.
- c. A statement on how the project will contribute to the applicant's overall research, scholarship, or creative activity goals.

3. Faculty Letter of Recommendation (up to 1 page)

The sponsoring faculty mentor or mentors must have their primary appointment in the College of Arts and Sciences. The letter should include:

- a. Confirmed agreement to support and actively supervise the research, scholarship, or creative activity described by the student.
- b. Description of the activities in which the mentor(s) and the student will work together.

4. CV (2 page)

Provide a two-page CV or resume that includes WSU ID number, contact information, and academic credentials relevant to the proposed project.

Format and Deadline

Submit application as a <u>single pdf attachment</u> in an email to <u>cas.gfs@wsu.edu</u> no later than 5pm on January 26, 2024.

Terms and Conditions of Award

Students must be enrolled for 2024/2025 academic year. Funds will be deposited into student accounts or a department account. The distribution is dependent upon the fund type and GUA. Recipients are required to submit an abstract to the 2025 Graduate and Professional Student Association Research Exposition, 2025 Academic Showcase, or other professional presentation prior to the end of the spring 2025 semester.

The successful applicant will be required to submit a final report by May 1, 2025. The reports may be in the form of a scholarly paper, or a short written summary that accompanies a creative product, such as a collection of poetry or an electronic audio or video file documenting a creative activity.
